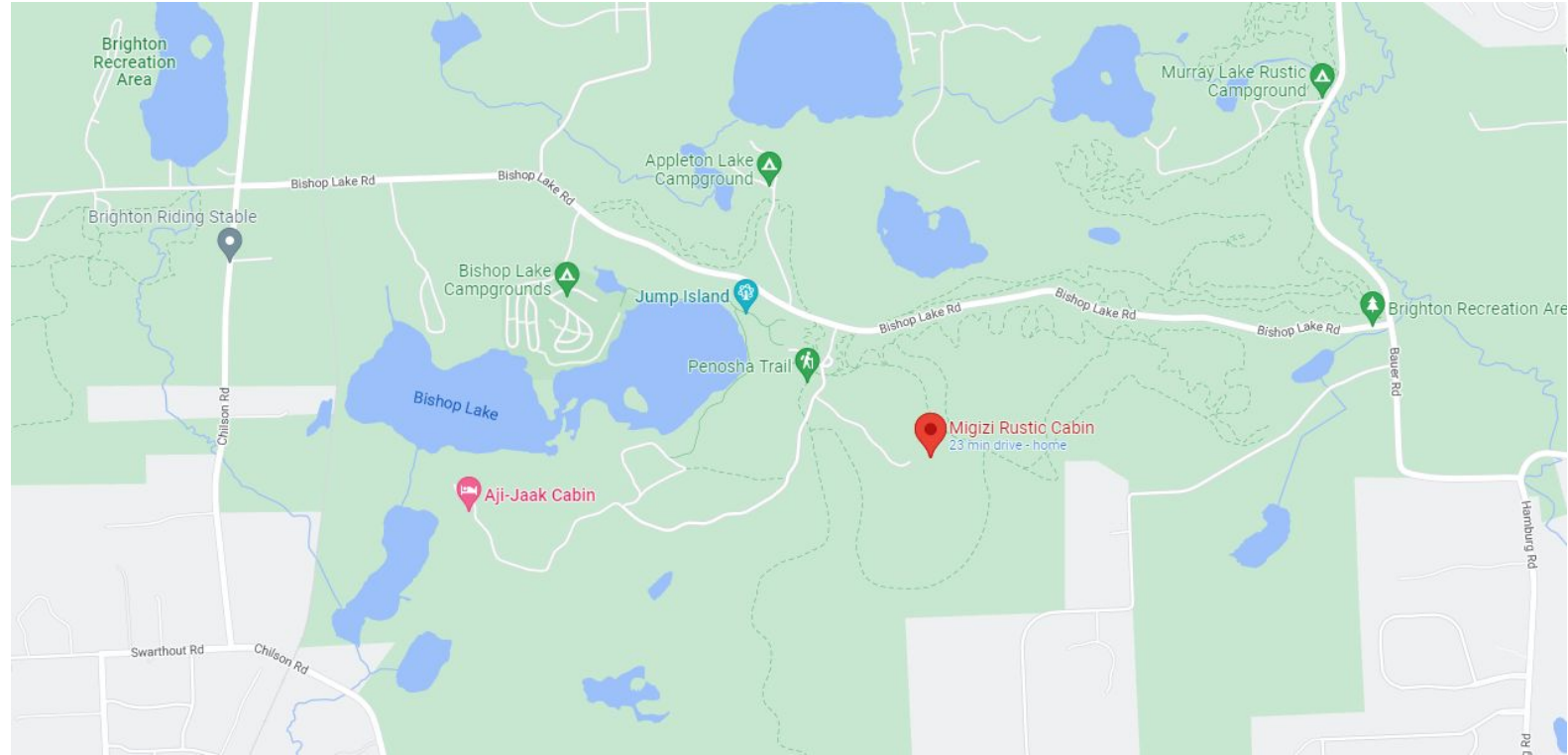
How to participate in Person

- Location

- Migizi Rustic Cabin
Brighton Rec Area

- When

- Setup Friday June 23
Time 16:00 (Weather depend evening fire)
 - Setup Saturday 9:00am
- Operation June 24 –
June 25 14:00 – 14:00



How to participate remotely

- The field day committee understands that not all feel comfortable being in large groups
- In the field day rules the ARRL allows you to add your home score to the clubs score, same as the past years
- Changes in 2023
 - Power output for classes A, B and C cannot exceed 500 watts Peak Envelope Power (PEP) transmitter output. Power output for classes D, E and F cannot exceed 100 watts Peak Envelope Power (PEP) transmitter output.

Operating from Home

What do I need to know?

- Read the 2023 Rules from the ARRL
- Find what Class you will be operating (Most will be a Class D station)
- Find what section you are in (Unless not operating in Michigan, Section is MI)
- Count how many transmitters you will be using simultaneously
- Exchange is # of transmitters,Class,Section EX: 1D MI
- Logging programs N1MM, N3FJP
- After Contest submit logs to ARRL using South Lyon Area ARC as the club name (Will send out more emails about this as the event is closer)
- Have FUN make some contacts and HAVE MORE FUN

Operating at the Field Day site

What is the Plan?

- 3A setup at Migizi Rustic Cabin Brighton Rec Area
- Michigan park pass required for entry
- Set up will be similar to last year
 - One 80 meter antenna
 - One 15-10m dipole
 - One 20m dipole
 - K8UT'S 40 Meter vertical
 - 6m antenna
- Will have a cabin for operating with 3 hf stations and 1 vhf stations
- Shelter will have room for food and there is a large outside area for gathering with a fire pit and grill

What is the Plan What to Bring what is being Provided

 - 4 operating stations with radios and logging computers

 - Antennas
 - Tables
 - Chairs
 - Generator

- What to bring
 - Food (none will be provided)
 - Headset for radio (if you have one)
 - CW key if you want/need one

 - Headlamps/flashlights for night time
 - Pens and Paper
 - Tables
 - Chairs need a few more
